WASYL PYSH GIVES \$10,000 TO TEENAGE CONFERENCE

An obvious highlight of the banquet and ball at the 56th Annual UOL Convention was the announcement of a \$10,000 gift specifically designated for the Teenage Conference held at All Saints Camp in Emlenton, PA.

The current Teenage Conference is the outcome of a conference that began at Camp Kon-O-Kwee, a YMCA Camp, in Zelionople, PA. Originally a program of the UOL, it is now administered by the UOC Office of Youth Ministry.

The founder of the Teenage Conference said prior to beginning of "Camp Kon-O-Kwee", if other churches sponsor camps for their youth, why not have a camp for our Ukrainian Orthodox Youth?" He proceeded to find a location that would be suitable for such a camp/conference, and then he proceeded to visit Ukrainian Orthodox Churches in the Western Pennsylvania and Eastern Ohio Region recruiting campers and generating support for what became known as the "UOL Camp Kon-O-Kwee Teenage Conference."

The founder and perpetual philanthropist of the Teenage Conference, as well as providing financial support to many other church-related projects was and is Mr. Wasyl Pysh. His generosity is legendary and annually he visits All Saints Camp and the "TC".

Mr. Pysh was in attendance at the 56th UOL Convention and received a standing ovation during the convention banquet.

The Church and League express thanks and appreciation for his longstanding and generous support.

56th U.O.L. Convention 2003 Palos Park, IL

"Abounding With Love, Fellowship and Fun"

They came from across the country by plane, train and auto—from San Diego and Minneapolis, from Pittsburgh and Carnegie, from Boston and Carteret, and from Philadelphia, Wilmington and Youngstown, and of course from Parma—next year's convention host. They also came from Coatesville, Ambridge, Northampton, Minersville, Minneapolis, Chicago, South Bound Brook, and many other cities. They arrived at O'Hara and Midway airports, the train station and via a circuitous route when they became lost near the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Oak Brook, IL.

Then they convened at the Hyatt Regency, a "moderate" drive from Sts. Peter and Paul Parish in Palos Park, IL. On **Wednesday**, the Senior and Junior Executive Boards met for lunch in an effort to discuss mutual issues and concerns about the Ukrainian Orthodox League. It was a unanimous feeling by junior and senior officers that getting together for a casual lunch helped greatly in learning more about individual members. Business commenced immediately with respective senior and junior Executive Board Meetings. Metropolitan Constantine joined the seniors for their meeting.

Audits of the national financial records were conducted throughout the day. **Convention Registration** began at 1:00 PM and continued throughout the day. Following Vespers at 4:30 PM, the official opening of the 56th Annual Convention was called to order by UOL President, Daria Pishko, with junior and senior conventioners participating. Welcome remarks were offered by: Daria Pishko, Sr. UOL President; Anya Priester, Jr. UOL President; Father Taras Naumenko, 56th Convention Spiritual Advisor; Noreen Neswick and Anatol Bilyk, Convention CoChairs; Faith Neswick and E.J. Roviario, Jr. Convention Co-Chairs, and Metropolitan Constantine. Attendance at the opening sessions included: 2 Hierarchs, 10 Sr. Board Members, 34 Sr. Delegates, 2 Sr. Alternates 27 Sr. Guests, and 5 Clergy—total Sr. registration was 80; 7 Jr. Board Members, 39 Jr. Delegates, total Jr. registration was 46; and total convention registration was 126.

The Metropolitan said: "God is good to us—he brings us back together. It has been 56 years and I've been to most of the conventions. . . . Where there is no UOL Chapter, there is no future. In most cases, it is not only the responsibility of the laity, but that of the priests and bishops. . . . The success of the UOL is the consequences of love-of love of Christ." Archbishop Vsevolod commented: "Listening to Metropolitan Constantine . . . it came to my mind . . . God has taken a chosen people and planted them in a promised land—that they should grow, multiply and flourish, and become the good vineyard. So you (this convention) will grow and flourish in the community where you have been planted. Do it with love."

The flavor of the convention was emphasized by Daria Pishko as she repeated the convention theme ***“Let all that you do be done with love”*** (1 Corinthians 16:14). The UOC Office of Youth Ministry’s theme for the past year, ***“We are family”***, was attached to the convention theme. It was noted that the importance of combining these two themes was that this will be demonstrated ***“through our actions here at the 56th UOL Convention”***. The juniors were excused to begin the **42 Jr. UOL Convention**.

The initial business involved the convening of CONVENTION COMMITTEES; **Group A:** Christian Caregiving and Missions (Jr. and Sr. Members), Youth (Jr. and Sr. Members); **Group B:** Clergy Candidate, Constitution, Nominating, Resolutions, Membership and Chapter Development. The groups were scheduled to meet at different times to permit maximum participation by the various delegates. The individual committees were charged with considering issues relevant to their particular committee, making suggestions for the Executive Board to implement, establishing a limited number of priorities, and suggesting appropriate staffing and budget requirements. Final approval for all committee reports is made by the convention delegation. The traditional HOSPITALITY NIGHT was hosted by Sts. Peter and Paul UOL Chapter, Palos Park, IL. Delicious foods and beverages in a comfortable hotel suite set the scene for enjoyable fellowship, making of new friends and renewing old acquaintances.

Thursday commenced with the Hierarchical Divine Liturgy with Metropolitan Constantine, Archbishop Antony and several priests and deacons in the convention chapel located in the hotel. The participation in Confession and Communion as always was a highlight of the Convention. A brunch was served at the hotel, with bountiful amounts of food that provided seconds or more for the hearty eaters.

Business sessions continued with the approval of the 55th Convention Minutes, review of the UOL Annual Report, Report of the Audit, Financial Reports and a reconvening of the Convention Committees. Business sessions were adjourned at 4:00 PM with great anticipation of attending ***Polynesian Night*** at Sts. Peter and Paul Parish hall. One of the most outstanding and enjoyable activities ever held at a UOL Convention was in store for convention participants and local guests. This included a performance by ***“Those Funny Little People”***, the fantastic performance of the “multitalented” Dr. Harry Oryhon as auctioneer of fourteen beautiful pysanky (designed by Mrs. Olga “Ollie” Cwain) that generated a profit of \$609. Then there was the great performance by the fabulous DJ, **Nick Demchenko** who is a member at St. Andrew’s parish in Bloomingdale, IN. His antics not only energized the young and mature on the dance floor, but was entertainment for the spectators. Finally, the elaborate and delicious buffet dinner added to a most enjoyable evening of fellowship and fun. A Small Compline was held at 10:30 PM at the hotel.

Friday began with an Akathist at 7:30 AM, followed by business sessions at 8:00 AM. Committee reports and final annual reports were completed by 10:00 AM when juniors and seniors boarded buses to visit the Weeping Icon, and later travel into the city and/or onto the beach. The evening social was a Hospitality Night by 57th Convention Host, St. Vladimir’s Sr. Chapter of Parma, OH. An array of desserts and beverages were provided in the “Parma style”. 57th Convention Chair, Melanie Nakonachy, was present to remind all that she was “the convention chair” for next year’s convention. A 10:30 PM Small Compline followed the evening festivities.

Saturday began with an 8:00 AM Moleben, followed by an educational lecture, “Love and the Sacrament of Marriage”, by Father John Chryssavgis. Father Chryssavgis discussed the various dimensions of marriage in a manner that captured the attention of even those who were not initially

Business sessions continued with committee reports, approval of the 2003-2004 budget, election of officers, unfinished business, future convention bids at which time Melanie Nakonachny reminded the delegation that she was "the chair" for the 57th Convention in Parma, Ohio, and final adjournment. Credentials at the closing session: 95 Sr. registration and 63 Jr. registration for a total of 158.

Late Fines were assessed to delegates who arrived late for any session. Michael Nakonachny served as a diligent Sergeant-At-Arms and all money collected will be donated to All Saints Camp as so designated by the convention body. However, when an additional \$10.00 was presented to "Auctioneer" Dr. Harry Oryhon for inclusion with the late fine money, he encouraged a higher bid and the race was on. A total of \$346.00 will be donated to All Saints Camp. Immediately following the closing of the convention, the new and old senior Executive Boards convened the first Executive Board meeting for 2003-2004.

Saturday Evening included 5:00 PM Vespers, social hour at 6:00 PM, and banquet at 7:25 PM. Atty. Mark Masur from Palos Park and President of Sts. Peter and Paul served as master of ceremonies and moved the program effectively. In addition to the presentation of awards, it was announced that Mr. Wasyl Pysh was making a \$10,000 contribution to the Church to be used specifically for the Teenage Conference.


Dancing, and fellowship and fun continued into the night with the traditional Grand Ball.

Very Rev. Protopresbyter Hallick Senior Recognition Award*

Very Reverend Protopresbyter Stephen Hallick-Holutiak Senior Recognition Award is presented to the most deserving Senior UOL member for outstanding work in the Ukrainian Orthodox League of the USA and his/her church.

This award was instituted in 1957 as the Orthodox of the Year Award and its purpose is to recognize a layman for his/her outstanding work in accomplishing the aims and goals of the League. In 1991, it was changed to the Senior Recognition Award. Beginning in 1995, the award has been given in the name of Father Stephen Hallick-Holutiak to honor the lifelong role of Father Hallick in the formulation and development of the League.

The recipient of the UOL Senior Recognition Award for 2003 is Paul Haluszczak from Saints Peter and Paul Senior UOL Chapter of Carnegie, Pennsylvania.

Paul has served in various roles and offices in his parish and chapter for well over 20 years. He has served as a parish board member as well as the custodian, a choir member for over 50 years and a member and officer of the All Saint Camp committee for over 10 years. He has served on the Chapter Sunshine Committee for over 10 years, taking the time to remember the shut-in or ill with cards and good wishes on behalf of the chapter. It's A Go — Construction To Begin In Spring 2004 Historical and Educational Complex/Museum

Give According To Your Means... For the Future of Your Church


The Metropolitan Council has approved the construction of the **Historical and Educational Complex/Museum**. The impetus for beginning construction **by spring 2004** resulted from the recent acquisition of steel construction material at a suprisingly reduced cost. This will necessitate minor modifications to the original design of the building; however, it will result in a slightly larger building at a drastically reduced cost.

Currently, approximately \$2.5 million has been earmarked for this very important project. This amount includes nearly \$1 million in contributions that are readily available for site preparation and construction costs. The

balance of \$1.5 million needed for the project will be generated via additional contributions, pledges, and an amount of income from the sale of crypts located in the UOC Mausoleum (S. Bound Brook, NJ). Other sources of financial support are also being solicited from foundations, individuals, planned giving programs, and state and federal funding sources. No money will be taken from the general UOC accounts for this project.
